Arrested: Adrian J. Gogue, 20, Mountain Home

Charge: Solicitation of a Minor (F)

Friday evening (October 15th) at approximately 11:30 p.m. Boise Police Detectives took the suspect into custody at a parking lot near Chinden and Eagle. The arrest is the result of an ICAC investigation that began when another law enforcement agency contacted Boise Police on October 14th with information indicating the suspect had been involved in soliciting a teenage male in a sex for pay proposition via text messaging. The suspect and victim are known to each other. A relative of the teen victim called law enforcement about the contact between the victim and suspect, initiating the investigation. The suspect, Adrian Gogue, was taken into custody at the location police say the suspect believed he was going to meet the victim after he travelled from Mountain Home. The suspect was booked into the Ada County jail on the above listed charges.

TITLE 18 - CRIMES AND PUNISHMENTS- CHAPTER 56 18-5609.

Inducing person under eighteen years of age into prostitution - Penalties. Every person who induces or attempts to induce a person under the age of eighteen (18) years to engage in prostitution shall be guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment in the state penitentiary for a period of not less than two (2) years, which may be extended to life imprisonment, or by a fine not exceeding fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000), or by both such fine and imprisonment.
